Note:—The term "Grade Pay" for the purpose of these rules shall mean "Grade Pay" in the revised pay structure in terms of Rule 3 (f) of the J&K Civil Services (Revised Pay) Rules, 2009. In the case of employees who may have opted to retain the pre-revised scales of pay, their T. A. claims shall be regulated under the existing rules."

II. In Article 309-A, for the word "salary" the words "Grade Pay" shall be substituted.

III. In Article 314, for clause (a) along with note thereunder, the following shall be substituted:—

Mileage allowance for journey or part of a journey on roads not covered by regular bus service, including pony tract on tour/transfer shall be Rs. 5/- per K. M.

Where in any case the amount of pony charges actually paid may be higher than what is admissible at the rates prescribed above, the Government employee may charge actual expenses against proper receipt which should among other things give the details such as distance covered, station from and to travelled and date of travel etc. A certificate of a Revenue Officer not below the rank of a Tehsildar of the area visited regarding the correctness

of the rates charged should be obtained by the concerned employee. In addition to actual expenses incidental equal to one daily allowance will be admissible if the period involved in journey on anyone day is 12 hours or more and half daily allowance where it may be less than 12 hours.

Note:—Where a Government servant travels in his own conveyance, the mileage allowance shall be regulated as under:—

(a) Motor Car

Rs. 10/- per K. M.

(b) Motorcycle/Scooter/Moped Rs. 05/- per K. M.:

Provided that the reimbursement of the expenditure on this account shall be restricted to the cost of air travel between any two points of travel."

- VI. In Article 320-A, for the words "With effect from 1-12-1998, officers whose basic pay is more than Rs. 10,000/- per month shall be entitled to travel by air on tour within the State", the words "Officers whose Grade Pay is Rs. 5,400/- and more shall be entitled to air travel by economy class on tour within the State" shall be substituted.
- VII. For Article 320-B, the following shall be substituted:

"Officers whose Grade Pay is Rs. 7,600/- and more shall be entitled to air travel by economy class on tour while travelling outside the State from Srinagar/Jammu to Delhi and vice versa and officers with Grade Pay of Rs. 10,000/- and above and those in pay scale of HAG + and above shall be entitled to travel to any station outside the State by the same class. However, the Chief Secretary, the Financial Commissioners, the Director General of Police, the Principal Secretaries to the Government and the Additional Directors General of Police shall be entitled to Business/Club Class travel on international flights.

Note 1:—In case of urgency in the interest of public service a Government servant who is not entitled to travel by air, may do so, within or outside the State, with the sanction of the concerned Administrative Department.

Note 2:— Project Advisor, Institute of Medical Sciences, Srinagar shall be competent to permit air travel to officers and staff subordinate to him, outside the State (but within country) provided such travel is considered in the interest of public service."

VIII. For the existing Note 3 below Article 320-B, the following shall be substituted:—

- I. "Note 3.— All the mileage points earned by Government employee on tickets purchased for official travel shall be utilized by the concerned department for other official travel by their officers. Any usage of these mileage points for purpose of private travel by an officer will attract departmental action. This is to ensure that the benefits out of official travel, which is funded by the Government, should accrue to the Government."
- II. After Note 3 below Article 320-B, the following shall be added as Note 4:—

"Note 4.—All the Travelling Allowance claims, where journey has been performed by air, shall be supported with the boarding cards in addition to the Air Tickets."

IX. For Article 320-D, the following shall be substituted:

"Government servants eligible to travel by air within the State shall be entitled to actual standard fare and the reimbursement of insurance premium for a sum of Rs. 50,000/- paid to Insurance Companies in case of all journeys by air.

Provided that the reimbursement of extra luggage charges by air in case of carriage of Government records (by air) shall be admissible subject to production of freight voucher and furnishing of a certificate of the countersigning authority that the extra freight was paid for carrying the Government records.

In addition to above, a Government servant shall be entitled to D. A. on the day of air travel as under:

- (i) If absence from Headquarters ¼ Daily Allowance on the day of departure or arrival does not exceed 6 hours
- (ii) If absence from Headquarters ½ Daily Allowance on the day of departure or arrival does not exceed 12 hours
- (iii) If absence exceeds 12 hours Full Daily Allowance.

Government Instruction No. I.—It occasionally happens that on a day when an officer is scheduled to travel by air from Srinagar to Jammu or vice versa the flight is cancelled but the Government servant's presence at the destination is necessary and the departure may not possibly be postponed or rescheduled. On such occasions the officer should share a taxi with others by taking a single seat and he will be entitled to fare actually paid subject to the maximum of air fare which he would get but for the cancellation of flight.

Government Instruction No. II—When an air seat is not available, a Government servant who is entitled to travel by air, may travel by sharing a taxi and charge actual taxi charges paid subject to the ceiling of the air fare which he would have otherwise got."

Subject:—Clarification of 2nd Proviso to Rule 10 of Revised Pay Rules, 2009 issued vide SRO-93 dated 15-4-2009.

Doubts have been expressed by various administrative departments regarding the application of 2nd Proviso to Rule 10 of Revised Pay Rules 2009 issued vide SRO-93 dated 15-4-2009. The issue has been examined in the Finance Department and it is clarified as under—

"That in terms of 2nd Proviso to Rule 10 of SRO-93 dated 15-4-2009 an employee who reaches the maximum of the pay band shall be placed in the next higher pay band after one year of reaching such a maximum. At the time of placement in higher pay band, the Government servant shall be allowed one increment on the pay in Pay Band+ Grade Pay attached to the post on which he/she has reached maximum of the pay band.

Moreover, for the purpose of entitlement to *in situ* promotions, it should be treated as one of the promotions".

Accordingly all the Administrative Departments are requested to communicate the above clarificatory instructions to all the Heads of Departments to settle such cases.

Whereas District and Session Judges/Selection Grade District and Session Judges of the J&K State approached the Hon'ble High Court by way of SWP No. 529/92 titled "T. N. Bhat & Others V/s State & Others" with the prayer that they have been given lower pay scales of Rs. 3700-5000 and Rs. 4500-5700 in 1992, against the old pay scales of Rs. 3150-4500 and Rs. 3300-5050 (appearing at S. No. 23 & 25 respectively of the schedule to the SRO-75/1992) instead of the appropriate pay scales due to them as per the status enjoyed i. e. Rs. 4500-5700 and Rs. 5100-6300 respectively (S. No. 25 & 26 of the appended schedule).

Whereas the Hon'ble High Court vide its judgment dated 17-4-1996 quashed the fixation of their pay scales as Rs. 3700-5000 and Rs. 4500-5700 appearing at S. No. 23 & 25 of the schedule respectively and directed the respondents to treat them to have always been in the pay scale appearing at S. No. 25 & 26 of the schedule to the notification SRO-75 dated 30-3-1992 i. e. Rs. 4500-5700 and Rs. 5100-6300 respectively, right from the date of its issuance, with all the consequential benefits to them including the payment of arrears for the past.

Whereas the said judgment was implemented by the State Government and issued SRO-163 dated 13th June, 2005.

Whereas, thereafter, certain Superintending Engineers of various departments also filed a writ petition on the same analogy bearing SWP 1608/92 (Santokh Singh & others V/s State) praying for same grades as have been granted to District and Session Judges vide SRO-163 dated 13th June, 2005. Hon'ble High Court disposed of the writ petition with the directions to the respondents to grant the petitioners the pay scales of Rs. 4500-5700 w. e. f. 01-04-1987 in

accordance with SRO-75 dated 30-03-1992 at par with District and Session Judges. The State Government filed LPA, which was dismissed by the Hon'ble Court confirming the order of the Learned Single Judge dated 17-05-2001 with further direction to the respondents to pay the benefits payable to the petitioners along with interest at the rate of 6% per annum from their due date. Subsequently the State Government filed SLP which too was dismissed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. Further a review petition was also filed which was also dismissed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.

Accordingly the matter has been considered by the State Government, keeping in view all the relevant aspects and ramifications with a view to implementing the orders of the Hon'ble High Court. In view of the foregoing sanction is accorded to the grant of the pay scale of Rs. 4500-5700 revised to Rs. 14300-18300 and further revised to Pay Band 4 of Rs. 37400-67000 + Grade Pay of Rs. 8700, in favour of the petitioners (Superintending Engineers) namely Shri Santokh Singh, Shri V. K. Raina, Shri P. N. Gupta & Shri Gajan Singh, notionally from 1-4-1987 and monetarily from 1-4-1990 at par with the scale held by the District and Session Judges.

Subject:—Applicability of minimum pay/stepping up of pay clarification-regarding.

It has been observed that the Govt. employees promoted after 1-1-2006 and pay fixed in their cases in terms of Rule 13 of SRO-93 dated 15-4-2009 are getting lesser pay than the employees who are directly appointed after 1-1-2006 and get their pay fixed in terms of the provisions of Rule 8 of SRO-93 dated 15-4-2009 as recast vide SRO-266 dated 31-8-2009. The issue was examined and it was decided to refer the matter for clarification to the Govt. of India. The Ministry of Finance, Government of India, vide No. F. No. 26017/159/2009-Ad.II(A) dated 5th March, 2012, have clarified the issue that stepping up of pay of senior promotees with reference to such of their directly recruited juniors appointed on or after 1-1-2006 can be allowed subject to certain conditions.

- 2. In consonance with the above clarification issued by the Government of India, it is accordingly clarified that the pay of the seniors promotees shall be stepped up with reference to the directly recruited juniors appointed on or after 1-1-2006, subject to the following conditions:—
  - (a) Stepping up of the basic pay of seniors can be claimed only in the case of those cadres which have an element of direct recruitment and in cases where a directly recruited junior is actually drawing more basic pay than the seniors. In such cases, the basic pay of the seniors will be stepped up with reference to the basic pay of their directly recruited juniors from the date the junior direct recruit is actually drawing higher basic pay than the senior; provided they belong to the same seniority list for all purposes.
  - (b) Further, Government servants cannot claim stepping up of their revised basic pay with reference to entry pay in the

revised pay structure for direct recruit appointed on or after 1-1-2006 as laid down under Rule, 8 of J&K Civil Services (Revised Pay) Rules 2009, if their cadre does not have an element of direct recruitment, or in cases where no junior is drawing basic pay higher than them.

(c) Stepping up of pay of the seniors shall not be applicable in cases where pay of direct recruits has been fixed at a higher stage on account of grant of advance increments etc. at the time of recruitment.

SRO-531.—In exercise of the powers conferred by proviso to section 124 of the Constitution of Jammu and Kashmir, the Governor is pleased to direct that Rule 5-A of the Jammu and Kashmir Civil Service (Medical Attendance and Allowance) Rules, 1990 shall be substituted by the following, namely:—

"5—A. Government servants covered under rules are also entitled to the benefits of 'Government Employee Mediclaim Policy' introduced by the Government to facilitate the employees to avail medical facility on hospitalization in or outside the State on cashless basis:

Provided that the Government may revise the maximum health cover ceiling, the family unit size to be covered, extend the policy to any group/category of employees and also to the pensioners including pensioners of State owned Corporations, the amount of the premium to be paid or other terms and conditions including renewal of the policy under the Government Employees Mediclaim Policy from time to time."

This notification shall come into force from the date of its issuance.
